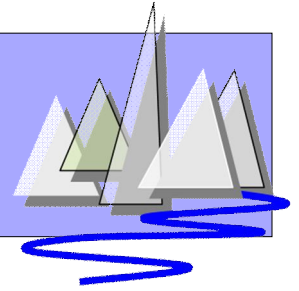

OLD business;

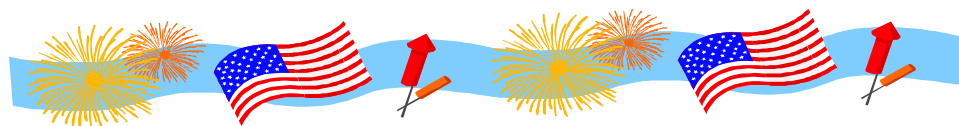
Review of district guidelines, no discussion.

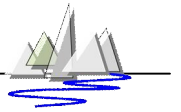
- 1) Volunteer

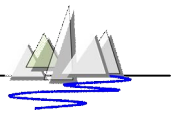
Your Idaho Falls Intergroup has set the following guidelines for listing meetings in the meeting directory:

1. The group or meeting should be in existence for 30 days or more.
2. The meeting should be registered with your Intergroup annually or as often as secretary or listing information changes. Officer or secretary contacts must register with name, address and phone number changes.
3. The group or meeting's primary purpose is to help alcoholics recover through the Twelve Steps.
4. All members of the group are alcoholics and all alcoholics are eligible for membership. "The primary purpose of any A.A. group is to carry the A.A. message to *alcoholics*. Experience with alcohol is one thing that all A.A. members have in common. It is misleading to hint or give the impression that A.A. solves other problems or knows what to do about drug addiction." "Our A.A. group conscience, as voiced by the General Service Conference, has recommended that 'family' meetings, 'double trouble' and 'alcohol and pill' meetings not be listed in our A.A. directories. The use of the word 'family' might also invite confusion with Al-Anon Family Groups, a fellowship entirely separate from A.A." (*The AA Group*, General Service Conference pamphlet, page 16.)
5. As a group, they are fully self-supporting.
6. As a group, they have no outside affiliation.
7. As a group, they have no opinion on outside issues.
8. As a group, their public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion, and they maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, television and film.

Please submit directory changes to your Intergroup promptly.

Every AA Group that wishes to may join the Idaho Falls Intergroup. Each AA Group that does so has one vote at all Intergroup meetings, provided they send a representative to Intergroup.

Remember the AA Declaration of Responsibility:
I am responsible ... When anyone, anywhere reaches out for help,
I want the hand of *AA* always to be there.
And for that: I am responsible.



Step 7 / Tradition 7 / Concept VII

Step 7 - Humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.

Step Seven is found on page 76 of the Big Book of Alcoholics Anonymous. It is in chapter 6, which is titled "Into Action". It is only one paragraph, and is commonly referred to as the Seventh Step Prayer:

"When ready, we say something like this: "My Creator, I am now willing that you should have all of me, good and bad. I pray that you now remove from me every single defect of character which stands in the way of my usefulness to you and my fellows. Grant me strength, as I go out from here, to do your bidding. Amen." We have then completed Step Seven."

My experience is that when I take the directions for the Seventh Step sentence by sentence it gives me a deeper understanding of what it is I am really supposed to be doing in this Step.

The first sentence starts with me getting humble and addressing my Higher Power with willingness that this Power should have all of me, good and bad. (I have been taught,

"All means all, and that's all all means")

Then there is the plea for my Higher Power to remove from me the defects that stand in the way of me being useful to Him or useful to others. Notice that I am asking my Higher Power to remove these from me...because I cannot remove them myself. The Seventh Step is not about me "working on my defects". If I could work on them then I would not need my Higher Power to remove them.

The third sentence is where I ask for the strength to do the bidding of my Higher Power. I ask because I cannot create the power I need, I must ask for it. But the only power I ask for here is that which is needed to do the will of my Higher Power. My experience is that when I do this I have all the power I need, every time I ask.

The Seventh Step is just like all the others...simple, but not easy. But all I have to do is have the willingness to follow directions... and then follow them.

Tradition 7 - Every A.A. group ought to be fully self - supporting, declining outside contributions.

The A.A. groups themselves ought to be fully supported by the voluntary contributions of their own members. We think that each group should soon achieve this ideal; that any public solicitation of funds using the name of Alcoholics Anonymous is highly dangerous, whether by groups, clubs, hospitals, or other outside agencies; that acceptance of large gifts from any source, or of contributions carrying any obligation whatever, is unwise. Then too, we view with much concern those A.A. treasuries which continue, beyond prudent reserves, to accumulate funds for no stated A.A. purpose. Experience has often warned us that nothing can so surely destroy our spiritual heritage as futile disputes over property, money, and authority.

7th Tradition - Long Form

The following is a Traditions Checklist from The A.A. Grapevine. It is now official service material from GSO. These questions were originally published in the AA Grapevine in conjunction with a series on the Twelve Traditions that began in November 1969 and ran through September 1971. While they were originally intended primarily for individual use, many AA groups have since used them as a basis for wider discussion...

1. Honestly now, do I do all I can to help AA (my group, my central office, my GSO) remain self-supporting? Could I put a little more into the basket on behalf of the new guy who can't afford it yet? How generous was I when tanked in a barroom?

2. Should the Grapevine sell advertising space

to book publishers and drug companies, so it could make a big profit and become a bigger magazine, in full color, at a cheaper price per copy?

3. If GSO runs short of funds some year, wouldn't it be okay to let the government subsidize AA groups in hospitals and prisons?

4. Is it more important to get a big AA collection from a few people, or a smaller collection in which more members participate?

5. Is a group treasurer's report unimportant AA business? How does the treasurer feel about it?

6. How important in my recovery is the feeling of self-respect, rather than the feeling of being always under obligation for charity received?

Concept VII - The Charter and Bylaws of the General Service Board are legal instruments, empowering the trustees to maintain and conduct world service affairs. The Conference Charter is not a legal document; it relies upon tradition and the A.A. purse for final effectiveness.

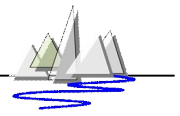

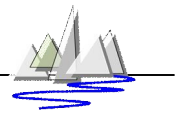
