Why do we need God in our AA business meetings or group consciences? Are we members of Alcoholic Anonymous so incompetent that we can't even conduct a business meeting on our own?

Based upon my own experience our competence or lack of to conduct a meeting really has nothing to do with Tradition Two. It has to do with our own ego when brought together with egos of other alcoholics. Although we may have the best intentions to do what is right for AA, often times our egos when threatened or challenged go off the rails causing us to act out of line with God's will.

I saw firsthand the danger of when ego is placed ahead of humility while I was attending the 2013 AA General Service Conscience. A discussion regarding whether or not the AA Fellowship should proceed with the publication of a commemorative edition of the original Big Book upon the 75th Anniversary of its first printing and issuance was underway. Although the pros and cons of going forward with this proposal began respectfully and lovingly, the discussion soon deteriorated into something less.

Eventually a Delegate from Florida came to the microphone and stated that for the past two days our discussions had gone downhill from loving expressions to near personal attacks on each other. This of course was particularly disturbing considering this body of AA members represented the Fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous in the United States and Canada. He concluded his sharing by saying that he wanted to take a moment of silence to invite God into our meeting.

After this pause, which probably lasted two minutes, the discussion resumed on whether or not to adopt the proposal. What a difference it made to our discussion! Members' sharing no longer approached personal attacks. The discussion was still passionate and energetic but it was done with respect and love for each other despite the differing perspectives.

The proposal to publish this edition of the Big Book was eventually passed. But what was really remarkable was how the tone of the discussion had changed entirely from one that was becoming poisonous and dysfunctional to one of respect and love. This is reflective of what happens when we invite God into our group conscience and allow Him to express his unwavering love and care for us.
