An Alcoholic's Moment of Clarity Brian M. – Coffee Break

In the non-alcoholic world people have what they call "a-ha" moments. We alcoholics often refer to those same kinds of instances as "moments of clarity." These brain bursts often occur when we least expect them and when we are in greatest need of them.

One of my first experiences with this kind of epiphany happened early in my sobriety. I was feeling overwhelmed by the idea of alcohol being "cunning, baffling, and powerful." Basically, I was fretting over the question, how am I not going to get drunk? Getting drunk seemed almost as natural as breathing.

At that moment I happened to be in an AA meeting when someone said, "you can't get drunk if you don't take the first drink." I remembered almost being floored by that statement for it was so profound yet simple. This was a moment of clarity and relief came to me immediately.

Another time I was struggling with how to cope with my family for I had recently gotten married during my second year of sobriety. I not only had become a husband but also became a dad since my wife had a young daughter from a previous marriage. What brought this mental thrashing around to a peaceful and serene conclusion was the realization that one of my major responsibilities was to simply accept my wife and daughter just as they were.

But a major "moment of clarity" came when I realized and understood that it was not enough to become aware of the thoughts these moments produced. Equally important at these times was the needed action suggested by these thoughts. Otherwise, they were simply good intentions.

Let us enjoy these moments when our murky thinking suddenly clears up. But let us not waste these moments by being stuck in neutral and not taking the required action if that's what is needed.
