## Monthly Article

I'm Either Part of the Problem or Part of the Solution

Some members of the AA community in Idaho Falls have been critical of the AA groups and meetings that are held in Serenity Hall. The basis for this criticism is that some of the meetings don't closely observe the Twelve Traditions of Alcoholics Anonymous and don't closely follow AA's singleness of purpose. Unfortunately I have to agree that a few of these judgments are true.

Several months ago before the pandemic wreaked havoc on our physical meetings I attended a meeting at Serenity Hall, which fit these criticisms uncomfortably close. The meeting was being chaired by a non-alcoholic and virtually all of the readings were done by non-alcoholics. Clearly, the conduct of this meeting was outside of the spirit of the AA Traditions and literature.

Adding to this included the sharing by an alcoholic member who was bashing the mention of the AA Steps and the Big Book when shared during this meeting. Regrettably there were several people attending that meeting who openly agreed with this.

But upon closer examination of the meeting, if patience, tolerance and love were practiced an AA member could hardly be critical of how the meeting was run and what was discussed. I am sure that these individuals who were involved had no malice or ill intentions towards AA. Truly, their only mistake was that they did not know any better. But why?

I, too, at one time subscribed to and spouted off how the meetings of Alcoholics Anonymous at Serenity Hall often times missed the mark. But to express these types of harsh opinions without offering some type of solution was clearly wrong. Essentially, I became part of the problem but not the solution because I did not lend a hand in trying to improve upon what I criticized.

Clearly against my own personal likes and desires, I left the comfort of a stable and established home group and joined the Coffee Break Group. I did this WITHOUT the intention of coming in and "straightening out or saving" the group. Rather, I came in with the attitude of what can I do to help carry the message to the alcoholic who still suffers. Perhaps, too, maybe my experience, strength and hope could add to the primary purpose of the group.

To those who are members of a group that meets outside of Serenity Hall, I do not expect you to drop your membership in your current group and join one of the Serenity Hall groups (although you can if you want to). What I do ask is that you occasionally attend these meetings and share your sobriety with us. Your service in doing so might save the life of that new comer who happens to attend their first meeting and hears solid AA recovery. Then you will have moved from being part of the problem to part of the solution.
