Idaho's First Female Delegate

Edith S. read ads in the newspapers for years, filing away in her mind that help was available – if she ever needed it. That day came. On August 5th, 1953, Edith could hardly wait for her husband to go to work so she could call A.A. The binges she'd been experiencing had been getting more violent, and she had finally had enough. 30 minutes after she made the call, a mild, kindly man, Wanny M., knocked on her door. It was the first time in years she'd felt that someone cared. Wanny explained that Edith was neither a criminal, insane, nor worthless, but a victim of the disease of alcoholism. When asked about slips, she often replied "I had plenty of those before I came to A.A. I didn't come to A.A. to go back to drinking."
